
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
Children and Young People with Cerebral Palsy



- Respiratory pathology reduced quality of life, increased morbidity and mortality rates
- Severe disability and complex needs:
- Dysphagia
- Gastro-oesophageal reflux
- Scoliosis
- Restrictive lung disease
- Abnormal muscle structure and tone respiratory secretions clearance
- Risk of recurrent chest infections

(Seddon et al 2003; Winfield et al 2014)







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Priority - Patient Safety

Aim

Based upon population health strategies, the project aimed to deliver 'Cost-effective/ Prudent/ Innovative/ Sustainable healthcare'

Objectives

- Reduce unplanned/emergency access to A&E, Paediatric Assessment Unit and Children's wards
- Reduce hospital admissions to Children's wards for children age 5-16
- Reduce length of hospital stay via early supported discharge
- Educate and upskill parents/carers/education staff in respiratory management underpinning national drivers
- Improve quality of life (QoL) for CYP reducing number of chest infections, less antibiotic use/targeted antibiotic use
- Improve parental/carer QoL to empower parents/carers to manage their CYP's respiratory health, to reduce anxiety by having options to escalate concerns
- Evaluate the impact of the service, including cost-benefit, social-benefit and sustainability
- To influence future service provision using an evidenced-based approach
- Establish scale and spread if successful



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Outcomes – comparison to 2019 and 2021

PROMs – improved

- Sleep
- Voice projection
- Alertness
- Feeding

PREMs – improved

- Communication with tertiary centre
- Holistic care
- Increased trust in MDT working
- Medication regimen upon admission and prophylactic
- Reduced anxiety

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Financial Outcomes



16 admissions were prevented, plus an additional 55 bed days saved compared to 2021 data

6 admissions prevented; 5 bed days saved compared to 2019 data

Average of **14 bed days saved per annum** for assessment-only admissions lasting 1-2 days each

Savings - minimum of **£28,350** in just 8-months

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Next steps:

Acquire permanent funding for an outreach service in SBUHB

Spread and scale the project across Wales

Development of digital technology (Telehealth) – forecasting/ prophylactic intervention

Collaboration with Swansea or Cardiff University to research impact of DNase on lung function and infection rates for children with Cerebral Palsy
