Driving change to improve the provision of Palliative Care services

The Specialist Palliative Care Team, with the support of the Bevan Exemplar Programme, are developing a Palliative Care Medical Champions programme.

The aim of the programme is to upskill and empower medical staff to improve care for palliative and end of life patients within an acute hospital setting.



What is a Palliative Care Medical Champion?

An individual who will motivate others to promote and improve the provision of palliative and end-of-life care in their own clinical area.

They will lead by example, advocating for their patient's and sharing knowledge with the wider clinical team, empowering us all to better care for our patients.



How do I become a Palliative Care Medical Champion?

Champions will receive training as part of a structured programme, to improve skills and confidence with managing patients with palliative care needs.

The 2-day, interactive programme will deliver education in a dynamic and individualised way.

The course will begin in **Autumn 2023**.

Day 1 of the course will take place on **Thursday 9th**

November, followed by Day 2 on **Thursday 30th November 2023**.

Lunch and refreshments will be provided.

Please note, attendance is required on both days.
